Description of the Planned Network Change(s):

Frontier Communications of Mississippi LLC, a Verizon company (“Verizon”), intends to retire the copper facilities at all remaining locations in the four (4) wire centers listed above. The copper facilities being retired support services that depend on obsolete time-division multiplexing and also use SS7 signaling. Verizon will discontinue services offered over these copper facilities pursuant to FCC rules before retiring the facilities. Locations affected by this copper retirement will have access to another wireline option, including VoIP service from Verizon or a cable company, or fixed or mobile wireless service from multiple providers including Verizon Wireless.

Description of Reasonably Foreseeable Impact(s) of the Planned Change(s):

After the retirement of the copper facilities, interconnecting carriers will need to make alternative arrangements for services formerly obtained via these copper facilities. Verizon offers multiple modern products and services available to replace services formerly provided over these copper facilities. To help ensure an orderly transition, Verizon may require customers and interconnecting entities to migrate services off of copper facilities well before the copper retirement implementation date.
